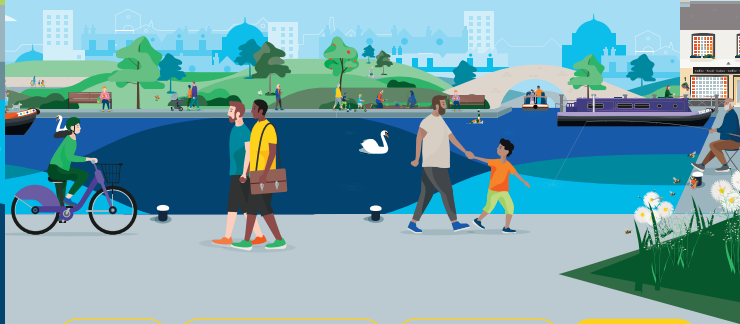
Making life better by water

The 'Shropshire Union main line' links Ellesmere Port on the River Mersey with the Staffordshire & Worcestershire Canal in Wolverhampton. This was the last major civil engineering accomplishment of Thomas Telford.

What we know as the Shropshire Union Canal is actually three canals – the Ellesmere Canal, Birmingham & Liverpool Junction Canal and the Montgomeryshire Canal – which came together in 1847 to form the Shropshire Union Railways and Canal Company.

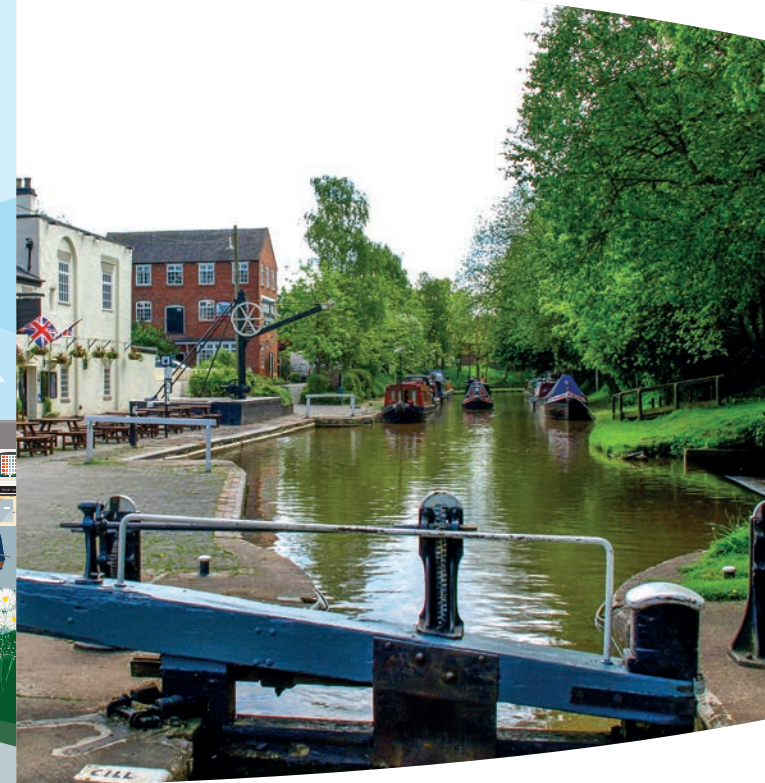

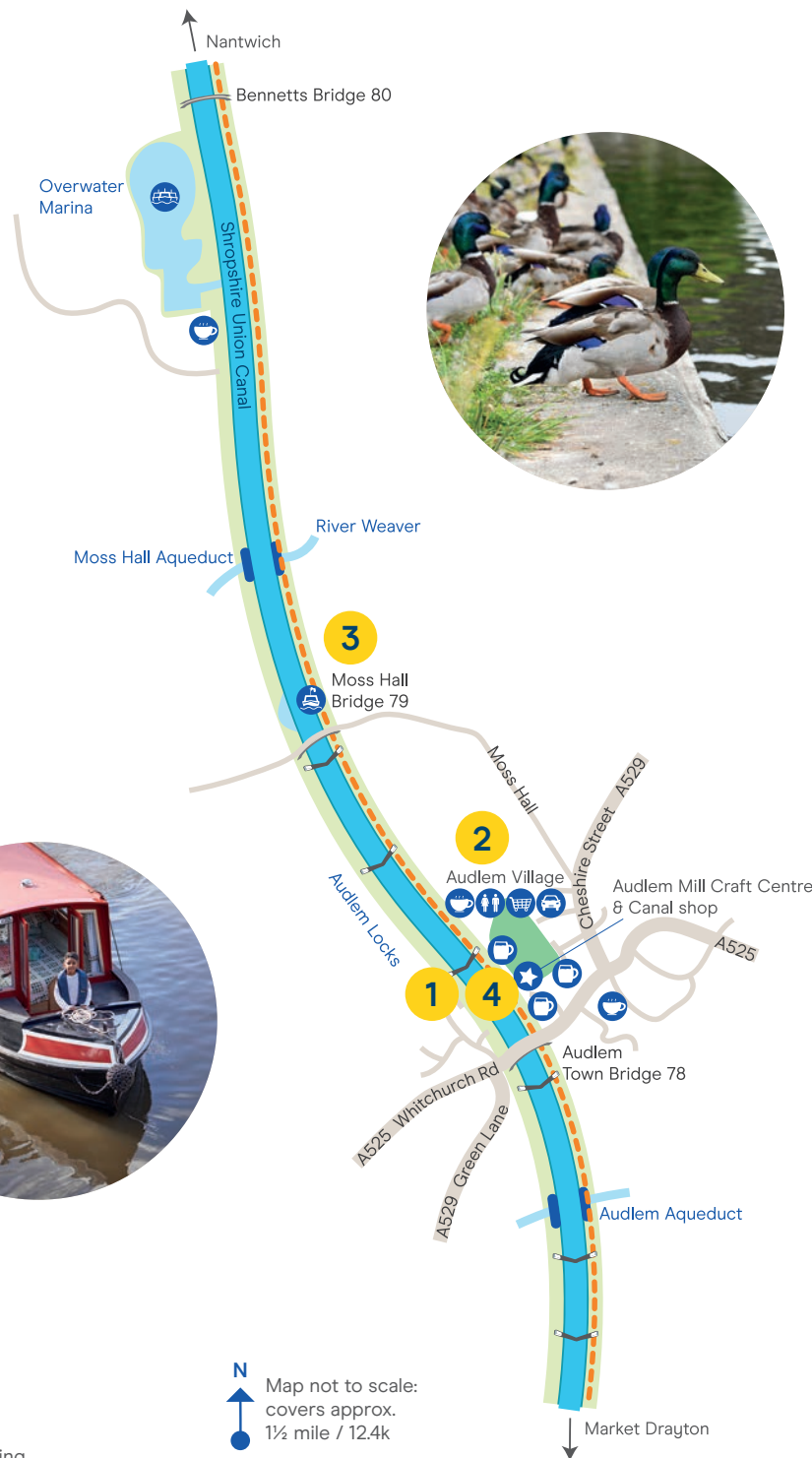

5 things to do at Audlem

- 1** Walk along the towpath and watch boats passing through the flight of locks.
- 2** Stroll around the village of Audlem with its black and white timber buildings and 13th century church.
- 3** Catch the water taxi from Audlem to the marina (weekends and bank holidays, Easter – October).
- 4** Visit Audlem Mill Craft Centre and Canal Shop, once a corn mill served by the canal.
- 5** Enjoy the wildlife along the canal – Canada Geese, swans, coots, moorhens, herons and ducks are frequently seen.

Did you know?

The main line between Nantwich and Atherley Junction was almost built as a railway before being built as a canal.
