Keeping history alive

Built in 1875, the Anderton Boat Lift provides a 50ft (15m) vertical link between the River Weaver and the Trent & Mersey Canal.

Originally, canal boats were lifted two at a time in giant tanks of water which balanced each other. Extra water was put into the tank to be moved down. As this tank descended, the opposing tank moved upwards.

The structure is a scheduled ancient monument and is included on the National Heritage List for England. It was used for over 100 years until corrosion forced its closure in 1983. Following careful restoration, the lift reopened in 2001.


