## Park-y- Brain Upper Bridge, 72

British Waterways managed the canal until 2012, after which the organisation became a charity 'Canal & River Trust'. Take a close at one of the few remaining British Waterway signs on the bridge.

## Goytre Wharf

The Lime Kilns were built in 1810 and were used to roast iron ore, to make agricultural fertiliser, lime mortar and lime wash.

## Park-y-Brain Lower Bridge, 71

On this bridge you can see a Great Western Railway diamond shaped weight restriction sign. This was one of many installed after 1880 when the railway took over management of the canal.

## Saron Bridge, 74

Notice the stop planks at the bridge. They are placed under the bridge and used for maintenance work to conserve water and prevent flooding.

## Goytre Wharf

The Monmouthshire and Brecon Canal was created when two Canals – the Brecknock & Abergavenny Canal and the Monmouthshire Canal were joined together at Pontymoile in 1812.

## Birdspool Bridge, 70

The canal is wider near here because of a winding hole. Before motorised boats this allowed craft to turn around aided only by the wind.

## High House Bridge, 69

With around 400 boats on the Mon & Brec Canal, it's important to have areas where boaters can moor and use canalside facilities.

The canal here marks the boundary of the Brecon Beacons National Park. The weight restriction sign was installed by the London & NorthWestern Railway Company. You can see this sign on the road above.


