#### Keeping history alive

Until the Kennet & Avon Canal opened, boats had to navigate a long and perilous journey along the English Channel.

As well as creating a shorter route between Bristol and London, this new canal also opened up new trade opportunities, allowing Bath stone, which was quarried nearby, to be 'exported' to Bath and Bristol to the west and London to the east.

Once the railway arrived, the canal fell into disrepair. For decades, teams of volunteers laboured to bring the waterway back to life and today it is one of the most popular canals in England.

- 1 Enjoy a peaceful stroll along the canal into the bustling city of Bath (3 miles/4.8km).
- 2 Cycle along the towpath to the historic Claverton Pumping Station, built by engineer John Rennie to supply the canal with water (4 miles/6.5km).
- **3 Chat** with our friendly volunteers and find out how we are are looking after the canal and its wildlife.
- 4 Have a picnic alongside the canal, look out for the waterbirds and enjoy spending some time by water.
- **5 Explore** the pretty village of Bathampton, its history stretches back to Roman times.

clay, Plasticine. This
world-famous material
was produced in the
village until 1983.
