Keeping history alive

While today, the picturesque Oxford Canal meanders slowly through the countryside, in the 18th century it had a very different feel.

Its arrival to Banbury in 1778 brought a cheap supply of coal from Warwickshire, and much prosperity to the town. The first delivery of 200 tons of coal was met by a large and enthusiastic crowd of spectators.

For the next 15 years, it was the most important and profitable transport link in Britain, with most commercial traffic travelling between the Midlands and London using the route.

- **5 Make** the most of the towpath and enjoy a traffic-free cycle ride to Cropredy (7.7km/4.7 miles).

Did you know?

Tooley's Boatyard is a scheduled ancient monument and the oldest working dry dock in Britain. Boats have been built and repaired in this boatyard since 1790.
