Keeping history alive

The Leeds & Liverpool Canal is the longest in Britain, stretching for 127 miles (205km). It took 46 years to complete and opened in 1816.

Leeds Dock was built in 1843 to serve traffic on the canal and the River Aire and enable goods to be transferred between canal boats and river boats.



5 things to do at Leeds Waterfront

- Take a water taxi from Leeds Dock to Granary Wharf and explore Leeds Waterfront by boat.
- Visit the Royal Armouries and discover 5,000 years of arms and armour.
- Relax or picnic in Whitehall Riverside Pocket Park a short stroll along the Leeds & Liverpool Canal.
- Stop by The Tetley, an art deco building that was the headquarters of Tetley Brewery and is now a familyfriendly contemporary art gallery, with a cafe and under 5s play zone.
- Pause for a drink or bite to eat at one of the many cafes and restaurants located along the waterfront from Leeds Dock to Granary Wharf and enjou some time by water.
