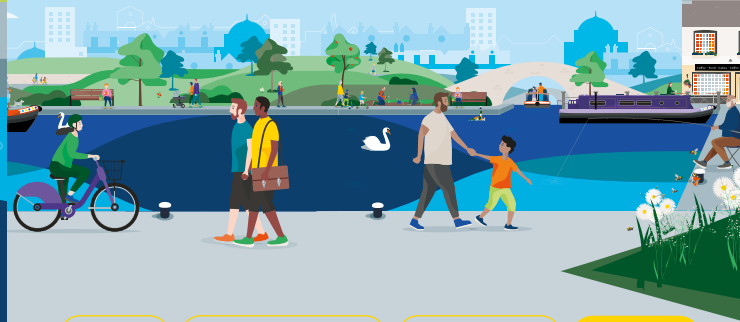
Making life better by water

Middlewich is located on the confluence of three rivers – the Dane, the Croco and the Wheelock, and three canals – the Shropshire Union, Trent & Mersey and Wardle. The canals linked the town with local, regional and world markets. As well as salt, Middlewich was noted for its dairy products and the production of silk.

The number of wharves in the town are testament to the importance of Middlewich as a port and trading place during the Industrial Revolution.

- 2** Follow the Middlewich Canal and Salt Trail.
- 3** Enjoy a picnic on the banks of the canal and feel the benefits of spending time by water.
- 4** Visit the historic town with its many events and independent shops.
- 5** Chat to our friendly volunteer lock keepers, they'll tell you more about the history of the waterway and what you can do in the area.

Middlewich was founded by the Romans who gave it the name Salinae because of its surrounding salt deposits.
