



Cambrian Wharf, Birmingham

Many canals were built to serve Birmingham, on different levels and with different water sources.

Sometimes these canals run alongside each other, and sometimes they cross, with the higher one on an aqueduct.

Cambrian Wharf, on the Birmingham New Main Line (c.1824) is on the 'Birmingham Level', 53 miles of canal with no locks, shown dark blue on the map.

The other canals are all lower than the Birmingham Level except for the Wolverhampton Level (light green) and the Titford Canal (dark green)
