Keeping history alive

The Grand Union Canal is made up of several stretches of waterway. Market Harborough Arm is one of these and branches off the Leicester Line.

The arrival of a canal to Market Harborough in 1809 boosted the fortunes of the town and the Wharf quickly became a busy distribution centre for industry. Goods such as worsted cloth, grain, bricks, beer and coal arrived on boats from around the country.

The coming of the railways sounded the death knell for canals and the waterway gradually fell into disrepair.
