Keeping history alive

Portland Basin was an important interchange between three canals. Ashton Canal delivered coal to nearby textile mills and made the return journey with cloth to Manchester. The Peak Forest Canal delivered cargo to the north west, and the Huddersfield Narrow Canal crossed the Pennines to the north east.

Portland Basin Warehouse (Ashton Canal Warehouse) was built in 1834 with three canal arms, instead of the usual two, which enabled barges to come right into the building to unload.

Did you know?

Portland Basin Warehouse (also known as Ashton Canal Warehouse) was one of the largest and most expensive canal storage buildings ever constructed.
