Keeping history alive

Hebden Bridge has been a manufacturing hub since the 15th century. At that time industry was based on hand-loom weaving. During the Industrial Revolution, its prime valley location, fast-flowing streams and access to wool markets saw mills spring up alongside the River Hebden.


The opening of the Rochdale Canal in 1798 connected the town with Manchester and Sowerby Bridge, vastly improving the transportation of goods to and from the area.
