Keeping history alive

Unlike 'narrow gauge' canals, such as those in the Midlands, the South Yorkshire Navigations were built to accommodate much larger Yorkshire keels.

These 61ft (18.6m) long and 15ft (4.6m) wide boats were powered by sail. If there was no wind they were 'bowhauled' by the families that owned them. There were also 'horse marines', a man and horse who would tow the boat on the navigation for a price.



- **3 Have** a picnic on the grassy banks of the River Don and feel the benefits of spending time by water.
- 4 Watch the boats navigating Sprotborough Lock.
- 5 Pack binoculars and see which birds you can spot or watch anglers fishing for roach, chub, tench or pike.

Did you know?

The Sheffield & South Yorkshire Navigation is actually made up of four waterways linking the River Trent to Sheffield – the Sheffield & Tinsley Canal, the Don Navigation, the Stainforth & Keadby Canal and the New Junction Canal.
