#### Keeping history alive

The first lock at Naburn was built in 1757 and was one of the earliest examples of canal engineering in England.

In Victorian times, a larger lock was built alongside the original one to allow large freight barges to pass through, transporting goods to and from York and Hull. Queen Victoria's grandson, Prince Albert Victor opened the locks.
