#### Keeping history alive

When the Kennet & Avon Canal opened in 1810 it soon became a hive of activity with up to 200 boats working on the waterway.

During the 19th century, there were several wharves at Seend where cargo could be loaded and unloaded – primarily iron ore quarried at Seend Iron Works which was then sent along the canal to Wales to be smelted.

The canal was bought by the Great Western Railway Company in 1851 and was allowed to gradually fall into disrepair before being restored by teams of volunteers and re-opened by Queen Elizabeth II in 1990.



## 5 things to do at Seend Locks

- 1 Walk along the towpath to Semington Bottom Lock, the junction with the Wilts & Berks Canal which is being restored by volunteers from the Wilts & Berks Canal Trust (1 mile/1.6km).
- 2 Have a picnic alongside the canal and enjoy spending some time by water.
- Watch the colourful canal boats making their way through the locks.

- 4 Stroll along the canal and keep a look out for the many waterbirds that can be found along the canal including kingfishers, moot swans, coots, moorhens and herons.
- 5 Enjoy a traffic-free cycle ride to Caen Hill lock flight, one of the wonders of the waterways (2.4 miles/4km).

### Did you know?

The lock gates that you can see on the canal are made in our workshops using the same methods as were used 200 years ago. Each lock gate is unique and can take up to a month to make.
