Canals and rivers are full of animals, birds and fish.



In the water, in the air, in the trees and bushes, if you look closely you are bound to see something making its home, even in the middle of the city. Here are some fascinating facts about the creatures you might see, or turn over to play our 'wildlife bingo' and see how many animals you can spot.

- Water voles are one of Britain's most endangered species, with statistics showing a decline since the 1970s due to increased development and American mink.
- Dragonflies spend most of their lives living underwater, and swim around by squirting water out of their bums!
- Kingfishers dive for their food and must eat their own bodyweight every day. That's like a seven-year-old eating around 45 pizzas in one day!
