CHARITY OFFERS FREE ENTRY TO CANAL MUSEUM THIS DECEMBER AS PART OF UK-WIDE THANK YOU TO NATIONAL LOTTERY PLAYERS

The Canal & River Trust, the charity that looks after the Canal Museum at Stoke Bruerne, is inviting people to enjoy a free visit to the museum as part of a nationwide campaign to thank National Lottery players.

The museum is housed in a restored corn mill at the top of a flight of canal locks on the Grand Union Canal and has been opened to the public since 1963. Visitors to the museum, which is run by Canal & River Trust staff and volunteers, can follow the story of Britain's canals, from the great engineers and navvies who created them to the boat families, leggers and lock keepers who lived and worked on the canal.

The Canal & River Trust will be opening its doors between the 13 and 17 December between 11am and 3pm with entry to the museum being for free to anyone who brings a National Lottery ticket with them when they visit.

The Stoke Bruerne Canal Partnership recently received £67,000 from the Heritage Lottery Fund to pay for a canal side interpretation project which aims to tell the historic significance of the site to visitors to the waterway.

Louise Stockwin, museum manager at the Canal & River Trust said: "Stoke Bruerne is a wonderful place to visit throughout the year and we are delighted we can offer free visits to the museum to the supporters of the National Lottery.

"Once you've had a trip around the museum you can pop to the café and enjoy a warming cup of tea and a slice of delicious cake before heading off for a nice stroll along the canal."
