

A little bit of history



- ☐ **Explore** the canals on a Go Canoeing guided
- Use the towpaths to reach one of many great attractions here including the National Sea Life Centre, Birmingham Museum & Art Gallery and the Ikon Gallery.
- ☐ **Take** a boat trip and discover more about the canals
