Keeping history alive

Thomas Telford designed Horseshoe Falls, a 460ft/140m long weir, to feed water from the River Dee into the Llangollen Canal. The distinctively shaped weir, which opened in 1808, helps to create a pool of water that can enter the canal.

In the early 20th century railways took over as the main means of transportation, subsequently, canals across Wales and England fell into decline. However, its role in transferring water to Cheshire saved the stretch of canal from Llangollen to Nantwich, including the aqueducts at Pontcysyllte and Chirk.

In 2009 the weir and 11 miles (18km) of the Llangollen Canal, from Horseshoe Falls to Chirk Aqueduct was awarded World Heritage Status.

5 things to do at Llangollen

- 1** Take a boat trip along the canal and experience the landscape from the water, some boats are still drawn by horse.
- 2** Stroll along the towpath to the Horseshoe Falls also designed by Thomas Telford.
- 3** Visit the Llangollen Museum and find out more about the town and surrounding area.
- 4** Take a look at the steam railway, the only standard gauge railway in North Wales.
- 5** Enjoy a canalside picnic and feel the benefit of spending some time by water.

Did you know?

The Llangollen Canal supplies drinking water to Crewe and Nantwich via Hurlston Reservoir. Around 12 million gallons (55 million litres) of water pass through this stretch of the Llangollen Canal every day.
