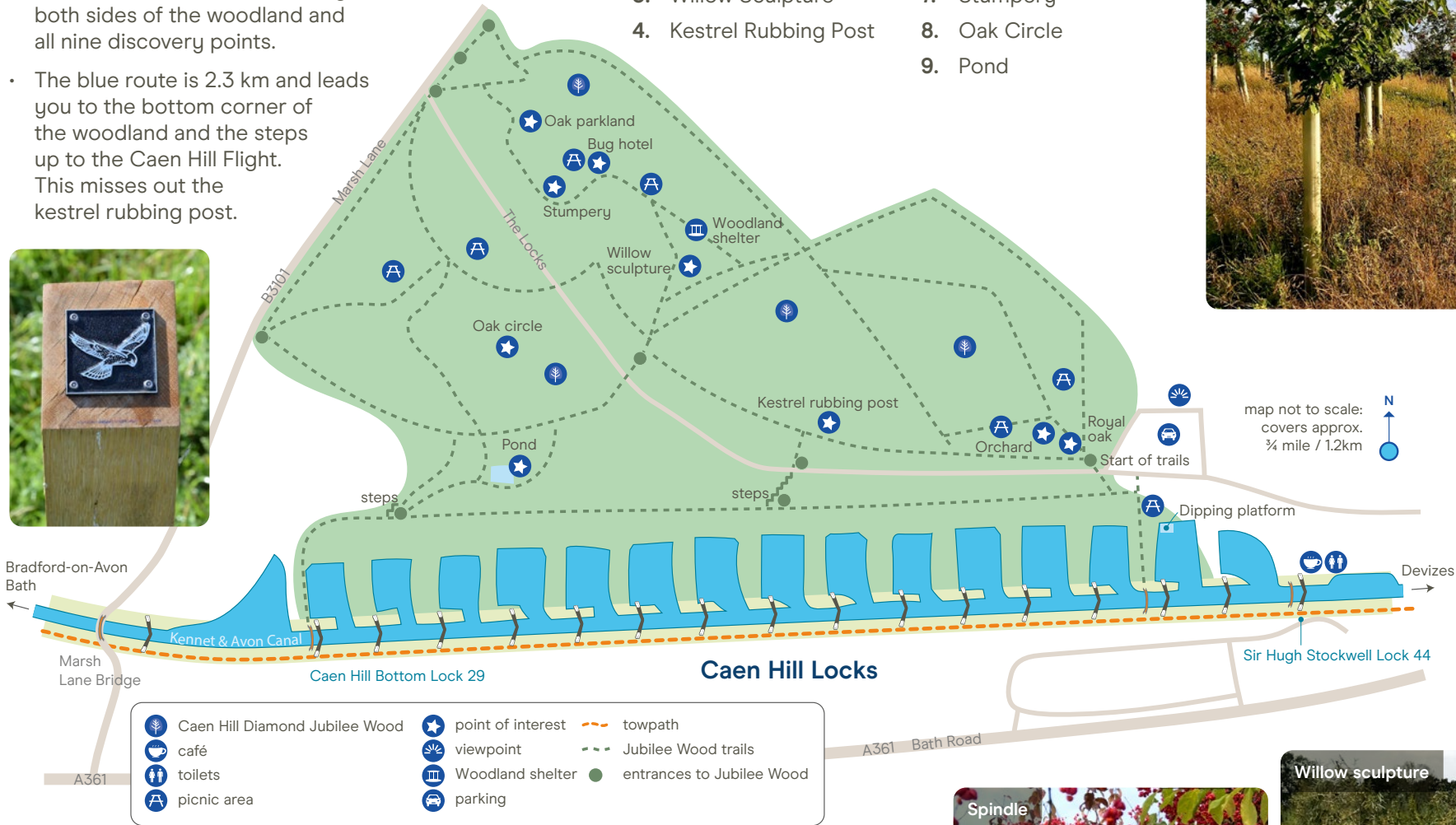
Discovery Trails in Diamond Jubilee Wood

You can choose from three waymarked circular trails:

- The white route is 1.7km covering just one side of the woodland and seven discovery points.
- The red route is 1.8 km covering both sides of the woodland and all nine discovery points.
- The blue route is 2.3 km and leads you to the bottom corner of the woodland and the steps up to the Caen Hill Flight. This misses out the kestrel rubbing post.

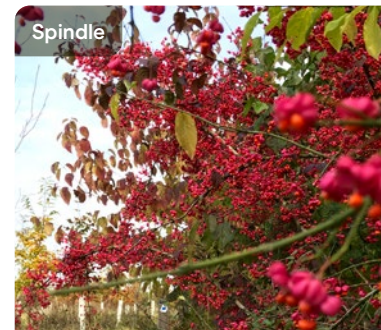
Nine features to discover:

1. Royal Oak
2. Orchard
3. Willow Sculpture
4. Kestrel Rubbing Post
5. Oak Parkland
6. Bug Hotel
7. Stumpery
8. Oak Circle
9. Pond

Caen Hill Diamond Jubilee Wood




Caen Hill Diamond Jubilee Wood is one of 60 new woods that were planted in 2012 around the country to commemorate the Queen's Diamond Jubilee and her 60 years on the throne.

A wide variety of wildlife has already made its home in this young woodland site.

Combine your visit to Caen Hill Locks with a leisurely stroll through Jubilee Wood or explore one of the three circular waymarked Discovery Trails. Please be aware that the land slopes and in wet weather some areas can be boggy.

There are picnic benches in the wood and fabulous views from the top. Look westwards over the Wiltshire landscape, reflect on the beauty of the countryside and, if you visit in the evening, enjoy the sunset. The viewpoint is next to Caen Hill visitors' carpark and is easily reached by people who find walking a challenge.

Getting Here

By car: Turn off the A361, signposted Caen Hill, on to the B3101 Marsh Lane. Then you will see a turning signposted Caen Hill Café. Continue through the wood to the car park, satnav SN10 1RF.

This is a Pay and Display car park and costs £3 for the day, payable by card at the machine. There are parking spaces for disabled visitors.

By train: Nearest railway station on a bus route is Trowbridge (about 30 minutes) or Swindon (about 1 hour), both on the 49 bus route.

By bus: On the 49 bus route between Swindon and Trowbridge. For the top of Caen Hill Locks get off at the Spar Shop in Bath Road.

By boat: Take a look at our web pages about Caen Hill Locks and see our notices and stoppages page for the Kennet & Avon to find opening times. Moorings are available above Lock 44 and below 29. No mooring on the Caen Hill Flight.
